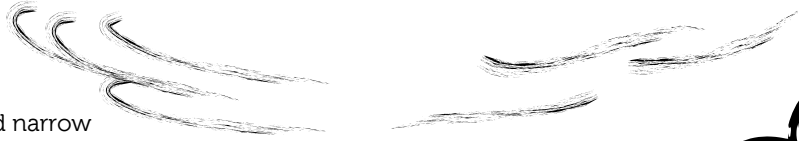


What Kind of Cloud is That?

Look up in the sky! It's a... cloud! But what kind? Learn how to identify different clouds by their shape below, then color them in! The next time you're outside, use this handy sheet to I.D. the clouds you see.

Cirrus:

Cirrus clouds have a hair-like or silky appearance that form white patches and narrow bands. These clouds are made of ice crystals.



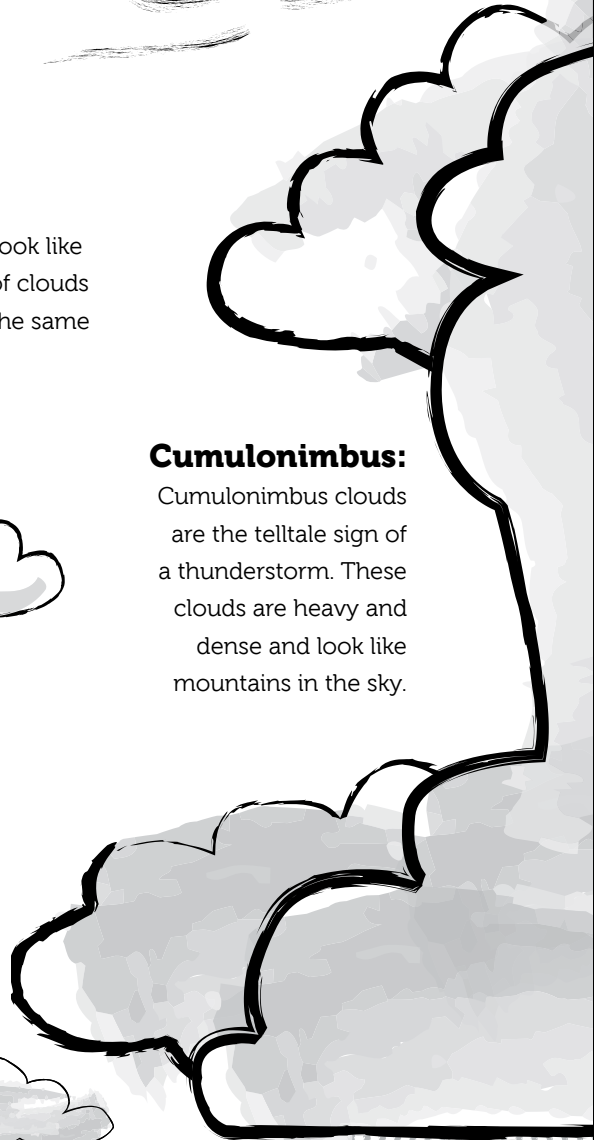
Altostratus:

Altostratus clouds look like a gray patchy sheet of clouds and often appear at the same time as other clouds.



Cumulonimbus:

Cumulonimbus clouds are the telltale sign of a thunderstorm. These clouds are heavy and dense and look like mountains in the sky.



Cumulus:

Cumulus clouds are white puffy clouds that look like cauliflower. Cumulus clouds usually form on clear days with blue skies and dissolve by evening.



Stratocumulus:

Stratocumulus clouds have a honeycomb appearance and are usually darker gray and fluffy.
